This meeting is governed by **Schedule 12, Part III, paragraph 14(1) & (2)** of the **Local Government Act 1972**, which states:

14(1) A parish meeting for a parish shall assemble annually on some day between 1st March and 1st June, both inclusive, in every year.

14(2) In a parish having a separate parish council, the parish meeting shall be convened by the Chairman of the Parish Council, or if the Chairman is unable or unwilling, by the Vice-Chairman or two local electors.

Additionally, **paragraph 15(1) & (2)** clarifies voting rights and procedures:

15(1) Every question at a parish meeting shall be decided by a majority of the local government electors present and voting at the meeting.

15(2) Each local government elector may give one vote and no more on any question.
